Mt. Morris Adult Education Program**

**Pupil Program (under the age of 20 as of September 1, 2020) Graduation requirements are 22 credits.**

**Participant Program (20 and over after September 1, 2020) Graduation requirements are 20 credits.**

The following courses will be available for qualifying participants to support attainment of a High School Diploma (HSC). *Equivalency Credential (HSE/GED) online courses will also be available.*
